

We use **to do, to buy, to start, etc. (to + infinitive)** after some verbs, e.g.:

| hope    | plan    |                   |
| arrange | try     |                   |

*learn    lend    play    do*

*start    book    help    get    go*

*She agreed to        him some money.*

*He forgot to        the tickets.*

*I'm hoping to        a new bike soon.*

*I've arranged to        tennis tonight.*

*They've decided to        a new company.*

*You promised to        me.*

*She offered to        the washing-up.*

*We're planning to        away this weekend.*

*He's trying to        French.*
