


## SECOND CONDITIONALS

Put the verb into the correct second conditional form.

 **Second Conditional**

**If + Past Simple, *would (not)* + verb**

We use the **Second Conditional** to talk about:

1. Imaginary, an unreal situations in the present.
2. Situations in the future which are possible, but unlikely to happen.

- when the subject is **I** and the verb is **to be**, we often say **if I were**;
- we can use **would, could or might** in the result clause;
- we use a comma only after the **"if"** clause.



*"If I were you, I wouldn't wear this dress!"*
