The Day I Made My Mother Proud

1 My mother, grandmother, and I live near the ocean. My grandmother takes care of me while my mother works long hours at a restaurant. I want to help my mother, but she says I can help her just by being good. Then she tells me to study hard in school so I can make her proud. I want my mother to be proud, but I want her to be happy, too.

3 Now I knew what I could do for my mother. Every day for a week my grandmother took me to the beach. I looked and looked, but I did not find a queen helmet anywhere.

4 "Maybe you could buy her one," said my grandmother. But I told her I did not want to buy a shell. The shells in my mother's collection came from a beach, not a store.

5 Finally, one day I saw the tip of a shell poking out of some seaweed. I dug and dug until I uncovered it. It was a beautiful queen helmet. I raced to show my grandmother. She patted my head and smiled.

6 That night when my mother came home I told her I had a surprise. I held out my hand and showed her the shell. "She's been looking for weeks," said my grandmother.

7 My mother hugged me. "I'm proud of you," she said. "I will put this shell where I can see it every day. Then, whenever I look at it, I will think of how hard you worked to find it."
