TEOTIHUACAN RUINS COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING TE	XT USING THE APPROPIATE PASSIVE STRUCTURE. 5
Teotihuacan was a major religious center as you'll see from the many religious monuments and structures found here. Its residents worshipped	
some of the same gods that other Mesoamerican cultures did. They engaged in human sacrifices, since human and animal remains 1(be)(find) in tombs. Sacrifices 2(be)(make)when structures were expanded.	
Teotihuacans seem enigmatic as we look back on them today. They 3(be)(say)to be a peaceful community of farmers, since the city contains no defensive structures. However symbols of war 4(be)(contain) in their temples.	
It was the Aztecs who gave Teotihuacán its name, when they arrived here in about 1320. The name means "City of Gods," and they believed the gods had gathered here to create the sun and moon after the last world ended. From their base in Tenochtitlan (in what is now Mexico City) they used it as pilgrimage destination.
