

Present Perfect Simple – Present Perfect Continuous – Past Simple

Present perfect Simple: I have travelled / Have you travelled? / I haven't travelled

Present Perfect Continuous: I have been travelling / have you been travelling? / I haven't been travelling

Past Simple: I travelled / Did you travel? / I didn't travel

Time Expressions

Present Perfect: always, never, ever, just, yet, for, since, before, This is the first time (this month/year...),

Present Perfect Continuous: for, since, all this time/all these years/all these months...

Past Simple: yesterday, when, ago, in 2000, last, that day
