

FUTURE TENSES

WILL / GOING TO / PRESENT SIMPLE

When we talk about holidays and travel, we often use **be going to** to talk about plans and the Present Simple to talk about future events in timetables. We use **will** for spontaneous decisions and predictions.

I am **going to fly** to Venice next week.

My flight **leaves** on Wednesday morning.

Maybe I'll **come** with you.

We'll **have** a lot of fun!
