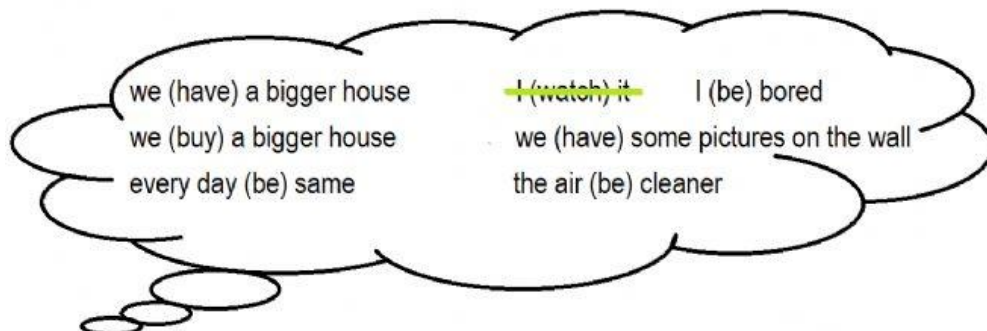


Choose the best ending and write it in.
