

Practice completing sentences in the Present Perfect Tense

Julia is a student. She has just learned how to create sentences in the Present Perfect Tense.

The Present Perfect Tense = Subject + has/have + the past participle of the main verb.

For example: I have finished my lesson.
My brother has drawn a picture.
My friends have sat down to eat lunch.

Exercise:

1. Look at the subject for each line. Choose "have" or "has" and type it in column C.
2. Read the whole sentence in each line.
3. Choose the correct verb from column F (on the same line.) Type it in column E so that the sentence makes sense.
4. Read the two examples to help you.
