

## Compound words with 'some' and 'any'

<b>some</b> (somewhere, something, someone, ...) → used in <b>positive</b> sentences	<b>any</b> (anywhere, anything, anybody, ...) → used in <b>questions</b> and <b>negative</b> sentences.
I'm buying <b>something</b> nice for my friend.	<b>Did</b> you find <b>anything</b> interesting? I <b>can't</b> see Sarah <b>anywhere</b> .
My workbook must be                      where here. ( <i>Mein Workbook muss hier irgendwo sein.</i> )	Does                      one know where the station is? ( <i>Weiß irgendjemand, wo der Bahnhof ist?</i> )
Let me get you                      thing to eat. ( <i>Lass mich dir etwas zu essen holen.</i> )	There isn't                      thing we can do here. ( <i>Wir können hier nichts tun.</i> )
Here is                      one who wants to talk to you. ( <i>Hier ist jemand, der mit dir reden möchte.</i> )	Is Big Ben                      where near here? ( <i>Ist Big Ben hier irgendwo in der Nähe?</i> )

## Compound words with 'every' and 'no'

<b>every</b> (everywhere, everything, everyone, ...)	<b>no</b> (nowhere, nothing, nobody, ...)
You can hear the sound of Big Ben <b>everywhere</b> in central London. <b>Everyone</b> in our class has to stay at home.	<b>Nowhere</b> else do you find so many interesting sights. There is <b>nobody</b> in the classroom.
I think                      one likes ice cream. ( <i>Ich denke, alle mögen Eis.</i> )	This road leads                      where. ( <i>Diese Straße führt nirgendwo hin.</i> )
thing in the Tower of London is very old. ( <i>Alles im Londoner Tower ist sehr alt.</i> )	body knows where the girls are. ( <i>Niemand weiß, wo die Mädchen sind.</i> )
