SONG OF THE PRESENT PERFECT

The song of the present perfect has come here to say you're fine
if you use it for something that started in the past that's still going at the present time
Like when I say "I've [redacted] your friend for years"
It means we met some years ago and we're still friends, my dear



The song of the present perfect has come here to say: hey man
you can use it for something that happened in the past ...but you don't need to explain exactly when
Like when I say: "I've been to the UK"
It means I went there in the past but you don't know what day

In the last few minutes I have [redacted] this tune somehow
You have heard a minute of this song up to now
I have [redacted] my words and I don't know what I can say
I hope I've [redacted] myself quite clear, with it now you can play

The song of the present perfect has come here to tell you that
You can use it at the time when a thing takes place
but its time hasn't [redacted] yet
Like when you say "I've been outside today"
The night has not [redacted] yet - it's the same day,
so you can use it, mate!

Finally the present perfect it's really handy (and not a crime)
when the action of the verb you are using
has some effects in the present time
Like when I say, "Hey look what I have done!"
I have just writing you this song and you can hear it now!

In the last few minutes I have sung this tune somehow
You have heard two minutes of this song up to now and after all of this
I hope that you haven't [redacted] bored
and the present perfect for you is not a problem anymore
