1. Talk about future arrangements (they usually involve another person, time and place).	2. talk about our own plans / intentions / dreams. 3. We use be going to to talk about predictions based on facts / evidence (something we see, hear, feel, smell).	4. talk about spontaneous decisions. 5. talk about predictions based on our opinion. 6. talk about promises, fears, threats.	7. talk about timetables and schedules.
