

Deer are the only animals with bones sticking out of their heads. Some animals have horns, but horns aren't bones. They are more like fingernails. Deer have true bones. Every year or two new bones grow from the top of the deer's head. At first, the bones are soft and covered with skin. Later the skin dries up. The deer rubs off the skin. The bones get hard. The deer uses these antlers for fighting.



Bees talk to one another by dancing. When one bee finds flowers for food, it flies back to the hive. The movements it makes tell the bees where the flowers are. If the bee moves in a small circle, the flowers are close. A bee moves slowly in a figure eight when the flowers are more than 100 yards away. Bees may tell about food that is as far as 6 miles away!



A sloth is an unusual animal. It lives in the Central and South American rain forests. Its shaggy, grayish green fur helps it to hide in the trees. The green hue in its fur is due to algae growing on the sloth. Depending on the kind, sloths can have 2 or 3 curved claws to hang on trees. It hangs upside down on branches. The sloth nibbles fruit, leaves, and twigs. It drinks dew or raindrops. It moves very slowly but is also a good swimmer.

Do you know about the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World? These structures were built long, long ago. One was the Lighthouse at Pharos in Egypt. It stood more than 400 feet tall. Another was the Colossus of Rhodes on an island near Turkey. This bronze statue was almost 200 feet tall. All but one of these wonders have disappeared. You can still see the Great Pyramids in Egypt. They were built for pharaohs 3,800 years ago!



Some people make skeletons for a living. At a factory in England, workers make human skeletons from plastic. A soft plastic called acrylic is poured into mold. There is one mold for each of the bones in the body. Workers smooth the rough spots and sort the bones. Then the bones are put together. Each worker is in charge of attaching a different bone to the skeleton. They drill holes in the bones then hook them together using wires. The finished skeleton is hung up on a rack. Skeletons are sold to hospitals and schools that train doctors.
