

## Part I - READING COMPREHENSION (A)

### Babylon 6

#### I

Babylon is an Israeli program that **translates** individual words or even long texts into many different languages with the click of a mouse. In 1997, this Israeli company sold computer users a CD-ROM that worked with Windows 95 and translated **individual words** from one language to another.  
5 Recently, the company switched to online sales.

#### II

Today, there are more than 35 million Babylon installations, many of them purchased by international companies. Home users, who are used to getting things free on the Web, will find many good reasons to pay for the newest version. In the new and **updated version**, you can translate not only words  
10 but also whole paragraphs at a time between any two of these languages: English, Hebrew, Arabic, French, Italian, Spanish, Dutch, Portuguese, German, Russian, Japanese, and Chinese.

#### III

Since updated words are constantly provided through the company's Web site, you will get new words added to the database automatically. It also  
15 provides 25 professional dictionaries in 13 languages. All you have to do is highlight a word or paragraph, click the right mouse button and press your keyboard's Shift key at the same time, and a "Babybox" opens on your screen. **Select the language** you want the text translated into and you will get it in seconds.

#### IV

20 Babylon's translation of texts gives an accurate idea of the content, but human translators don't have to worry about losing their jobs. This is because the program is not yet good enough to understand and translate full texts perfectly in the way a **native speaker** does.
