Phrasal verbs with 'put'

put--down put up put out put off put--up put on

I've got nowhere to sleep tonight, can you me ?

I picked up the box, but it was too heavy so I it .

I'm so cold, I'm going to a coat.

It's time to go to bed, can you the fire?

I don't know how she can with him, he's so annoying.

I had to the meeting, I just didn't have time to go.

Phrasal verbs with 'turn'

Turn off Turn on Turn --up Turn around

the TV, it's time for bed now.

I can't hear it, the volume !

I need to make dinner, can you the oven?

If you you'll see the fireworks behind you.

Other phrasal verbs

Sit down switch on switch off wake up take off

eat in/out try out give up meet up drop out

grow up call off

You've been in bed so long, what time did you ?

Why did you of college? Didn't you enjoy your course?

What do you want to do for work when you ?

'The seatbelt sign is on Sir, please can you in your seat?'

If you're hot then take off your sweater.

When you are in class please put away your mobile phone.

I'm tired of cooking, shall we go out tonight at that new restaurant?

I feel ill, I don't want to go to KFC, lets stay at home tonight.

It's so dark! Turn on the light!

Do you want to start smoking?

Because I was sick, I had to cancel the party.

I bought a new computer, I need to try it and see if it's good.

I finish work at 6pm, what time should we meet for a drink?

Remember, with some phrasal verbs we can use other word in between them.... for example:

The light is too bright, turn IT off

The dog is snoring, can you wake IT up?

Or sometimes we need to change the tense of the verb...
for example:

Last night I met up with my friends.
