Making Judgements Grade 5

Have you ever formed an opinion about someone in a story? Maybe you liked or disliked the character. When you are reading a story, do you ever stop to think about how you feel about the character? You may have thought that a character acted in the right way or made a bad decision. Have you ever felt as if the author was trying to shape your opinions?

When you form an opinion about a character or event, or about what an author wrote about a subject, you are making a judgment. **Making Judgments** means thinking about and deciding how you feel about people, situations, and issues you read about. Use your own experiences and values, along with careful reading to make judgments. Then look for evidence in your reading to support your judgments.
