- The **OBJECT** is the <u>most important</u> part of the sentence

PAST	WAS / WERE + Past Participle or

- ACTIVE PRESENT: Peter eats lots of apples
- PASSIVE PRESENT: Lots of apples are eaten by Peter
- ACTIVE PAST : Peter ate lots of apples yesterday
- PASSIVE PAST: Lots of apples were eaten by Peter yesterday

ACTIVE TO PASSIVE → 4 STEPS:

*Subject - yellow

*Verb - blue

*Direct object - pink

2nd - Direct object (active) → passes to be the subject (passive)

3rd - VERB:

IS / ARE + Past Participle or +ed





Past Simple My homework was done. I did my homework. **Past Continuous** I was doing my homework. My homework was being done. My homework has been done. **Present Perfect** I have done my homework. **Past Perfect** I had done my homework. My homework had been done. **Future Simple** I will do my homework. My homework will be done. I'm going to do my homework. My homework is going to be done. Future Be going to Modal I must do my homework. My homework must be done. I should have done my homework. My homework should have been done. **Modal Perfect**
