

MODAL VERBS

CAN

EXPRESS ABILITY

Affirmative:

Frogs can jump high.

Negative:

Frogs can't sing.

Interrogative:

Can frogs fly? No, they can't.



EXPRESS POSSIBILITY

Can you see me tonight?



EXPRESS PERMISSION

Can I go to the concert?

-Yes, you can./No, you can't.

MUST

EXPRESS OBLIGATION

You must wear a helmet when you ride a motorbike.

MUSTN'T

EXPRESS PROHIBITION

You mustn't shout in the library.

SHOULD

EXPRESS ADVICE/OPINION

You should go to the doctor. You look ill.

HAVE TO

EXPRESS OBLIGATION/NECESSITY

Affirmative:

I **have to** clean the kitchen. It's dirty!

Tim **has to be** home by eight.

Negative:

You **don't have to** clean the kitchen. I have already done it.

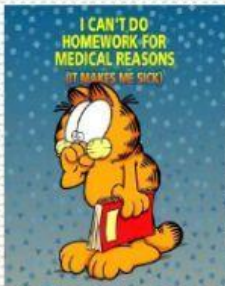
Meg **doesn't have to** be home by six. Her parents are generous.

Interrogative:

Do we **have to** wear a dress?
-No, it's not a formal party.

Does she **have to** travel by bus?
-No, she can walk there.
