

We use by to introduce the person or thing which does the action in passive sentences.

· The girls were followed by a strange man.

We only use by with passive sentences when it's important to mention who does the action.



- A man climbed Mount Everest for the first time in 1953.
- Mount Everest was climbed for the first time in 1953.
 - · The Beatles wrote the song 'Yesterday'.
 - · The song 'Yesterday' was written by the Beatles.
