Francesca's family is from Italy. They live in Glasgow in Scotland. 'We speak English at home,' she says, 'but I speak Italian, too. We go to Italy every year to visit my grandparents and I speak Italian then.'

Winston's grandparents are from Jamaica. Winston lives in Birmingham. 'English is the language of Jamaica,' he says. 'So everyone in my family speaks English. I speak Spanish, too. We learn it at school.'

People from Britain live and work in other countries, too. Most of them go to other English-speaking countries - Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Canada and the USA.
