Future: Be going to

We form "BE GOING TO" like this:



+ V. TO BE + GOING TO + INFINITIVE

<u>AFFIRMATIVE</u>	<u>NEGATIVE</u>	<u>INTERROGATIVE</u>
I am going to study	I am not going to study	Am I going to study?
You are going to study	You aren't going to study	Are you going to study?
He/She/It is going to study	He/She/It isn't going to study	Is he/she/it going to study?
We are going to study	We aren't going to study	Are we going to study?
You are going to study	You aren't going to study	Are you going to study?
They are going to study	They aren't going to study	Are they going to study?

We use "BE GOING TO" to talk about:

- Future plans:** I am going to visit my grandparents this weekend.
- Intentions:** I've put on some kilos. I am going to join a gym.
- Predictions with evidence:** Look at the clouds in the sky! It is going to rain!
