
PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE OR PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS





Present perfect VS

We use Present Perfect Simple for:

- completed actions, when we are talking about some result.

I've set up a Twitter account. Will you follow me?

- when we say how often something has happened

Our team has won three times this season.

- with verbs that are not used in Continuous tenses I've had this smart phone for 2 years already.

We use Present Perfect Continuous for:

- an action that started in the past and is still in progress

Present perfect continuous

Emphasis on ACTIVITY

I've been working a lot this semester.

(we often use FOR and SINCE to say how long the action has been in progress)

Present perfect

Emphasis on RESULT

- for an action that has recently been in progress and which explains the current
