

Simple and Compound



A simple sentence is a sentence with only one subject and predicate:

The pitcher threw the ball to first base.

A compound sentence is two simple sentences joined by a comma and a conjunction such as **and, but, or,** or **so.**

The pitcher threw the ball, **and** the batter hit it.
