

## Thames Town, a little English town in China

The building company *Hong Kong Housing* has built a new suburb in Shanghai, a city with a population of more than 15 million people. But this suburb is not like other parts of Shanghai, it is a little piece of England. The name of the new area is "Thames Town". The manager of *Hong Kong Housing*, Shi Guangsheng, says many people in this area of China want to buy an English house and live in an English town.

The rich Shanghai businessman can do some gardening, too. Every house in "Thames Town" has got an English lawn and there are long gardens with ponds and tall hedges. But there is a problem: the houses in this part of town cost a minimum of \$400,000!
