- Known as the "Lone Star" flag
- Blue represents loyalty
- Red represents bravery
- White represents purity

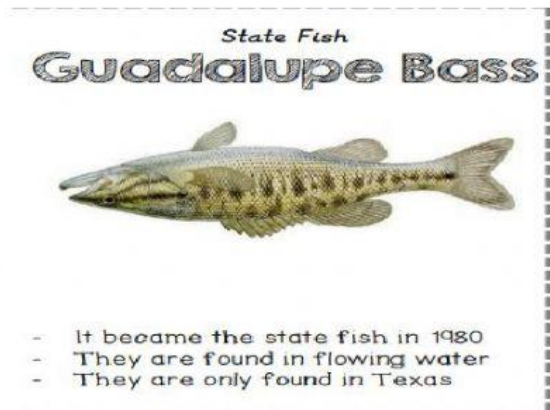


- It became the state reptile in 1993

- When threatened, they can shoot a stream of blood from its eye

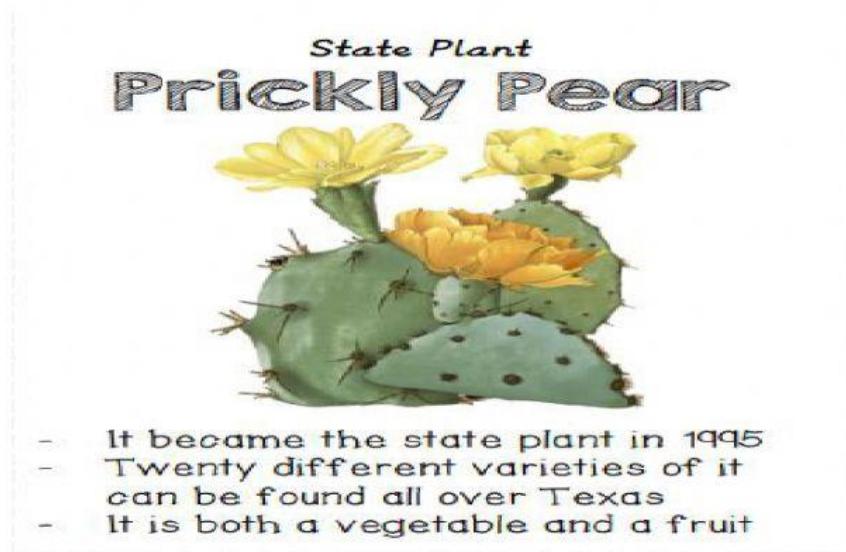
