Beginning: Introduce the topic or text. State your opinion.	Introduction & Claim
 Middle: Plan to group related information together into paragraphs or sections. Provide reasons for your opinion. Introduce each paragraph with a sentence that states the reason or the main idea of the paragraph you are about to write. Develop the middle reasons with facts and details that come directly from the text. This is called evidence. Use linking words or phrases to connect ideas within categories. 	Evidence and Reflections
Reflections: In each paragraph, include your thoughts about the evidence you include. You don't want to include only evidence. Your reflection and connection is important.	Evidence and Reflections
End: Provide a concluding section related to the rest of the essay. It might be a feeling, impression, or message you want to leave with the reader.	Conclusion
