

Mixed Conditional

Mixed Conditional
Third/ Second Conditional

Structure **IF + Past Perfect, Present Conditional**
(would/wouldn't + Verb (bare form)).

Usage **Present result of a past condition**

- If I **had listened** to your advice, I **wouldn't be** in the mess.
- If he **had checked** the map, he **wouldn't be** lost.
- If I **had gone** to university, I **would be** a doctor now.

Examples

Mixed Conditional

Second/ Third Conditional

Structure **IF + Past Simple, Perfect Conditional**
(would/wouldn't + have + Past Participle).

Usage **Past result of a present or continuing condition**

- If I **were** a good cook, I **would have invited** them to dinner.
- If you **weren't** such a poor dancer, you **would have got** a job in the chorus line in that musical.
