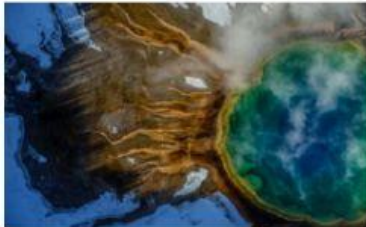

Yellowstone: Wild, Beautiful and Fragile

Yellowstone was the first national park in the world and it has 3,468 square miles covering parts of the states of Wyoming, Montana, and Idaho. It is surrounded by mountains and seventeen rivers flow through it. It's much more than just a park. In 1872 we humans decided to give it back to nature and this time we need to respect it.

In the remote past, about 11,000 years ago, the Yellowstone region was inhabited by native American people. So, before the Europeans arrived, many native American tribes hunted and fished here. They collected plants and used the thermal waters for religious and medicinal purposes. Tribes related to Yellowstone were the Shoshone, the Crow, the Blackfeet, the Bannock, among others.

This remote region of the USA is famous for its amazing natural beauty: it has an incredible variety of geographical features like canyons, lakes, 300 geysers, a petrified forest and 290 waterfalls. Every 91 minutes, the most famous geyser, called *Old Faithful*, ejects 14,000 to 32,000 litres of hot water over 100 feet into the air. Another natural wonder is the Grand Prismatic Spring. The colour comes from the microbes that live in the very hot water. The green colour is the chlorophyll they use to absorb the sunlight. Underneath Yellowstone there is a supervolcano: it's one of the largest volcanic areas in the world.

A sanctuary for wildlife, Yellowstone is home to grizzly bears, mountain lions, bison, coyotes, white pelicans and many others. *Canis Lupus*, the Gray Wolf, is one of the largest of the canine species. They were native to the region but in 1970 there were no more giant wolves in Yellowstone because they were decimated by hunters. It caused a terrible imbalance in the ecosystem with catastrophic consequences. Later, in 1995, scientists reintroduced them to the park, creating a very successful programme.

Yellowstone is a different kind of tourist destination: it's an adventure of a lifetime! You can go hiking, camping, fishing or boating in the middle of the frozen wilderness. Other activities are skiing and horseback riding. Yellowstone park is yours to explore with the guided snowmobile and snowcoach tours. Remember: you can protect and respect nature and have a good time doing so!
