	Cách sử dụng	Cấu trúc	Ví dụ
NEED	Chúng ta sử dụng NEED khi ta cần thực hiện một điều gì đó vì nó cần thiết .	S + need(s) + to + V-inf.	I need to run in order to keep fit. (Tôi cần phải chạy để giữ vóc dáng cân đối.)

SHOULD	Chúng ta sử dụng SHOULD khi muốn khuyên ai đó nên làm gì .	S + should + V-inf.	You should go to bed before 11 p.m. (Bạn nên đi ngủ trước 11 giờ tối.)
MUSTN'T (MUST NOT)	Chúng ta sử dụng MUSTN'T khi muốn nói ai đó không được làm gì .	S + mustn't + V-inf.	You mustn't start running without warming up your leg muscles. (Bạn không được chạy khi chưa khởi động cơ chân.)

So, I wouldn't say it's been easy, but I don't regret my decision at all. I've enjoyed being my own boss and I'm quite hopeful about the future. During the next 12 months I plan to rent some office space as I'd like to be able to separate work from my home life. I'm going to need to earn more money to pay for it but I think it will help me to focus on my work.
