should (recommendation/advice) (deber)	Must (moral obligation) (deber)	Have to (obligation/rules) (tener que)
A: I have a headache and some fever. B: You should go to the doctor. You should study for your exam.	*You must study for your exam, because if you don't pass, they are not going to continue paying your English classes. *I must buy a hat for these summer days because it is hot. *You must respect parents.	*To travel to Canada you have to have a passport. *You have to arrive on time to all your classes. *You have to "verify" your car if you want to use it in Mexico City.
shouldn't (no deber)	Mustn't (prohibition) (no deber)	Don't have to (not necessary) (no tener que)
If you are having gut problems, you shouldn't eat lots of chili. You shouldn't speed when it is raining.	*You mustn't drink and drive. *We mustn't smoke in public places. (It is against the law) *Staff mustn't be absent 3 days in a row, or they will be fired.	*I don't have to wear a uniform at work (if I wear it <input checked="" type="checkbox"/> / I don't wear a uniform <input checked="" type="checkbox"/>) *You don't have to come to work by car.

Need to = I need to go out.

Have to = I have to go out at 6.

Will ~~to~~ = I will go out.

Would = I would go out.

Should = I should go out.

Shall = Shall we go out.
