The sea'll be full of splashing and splishing.

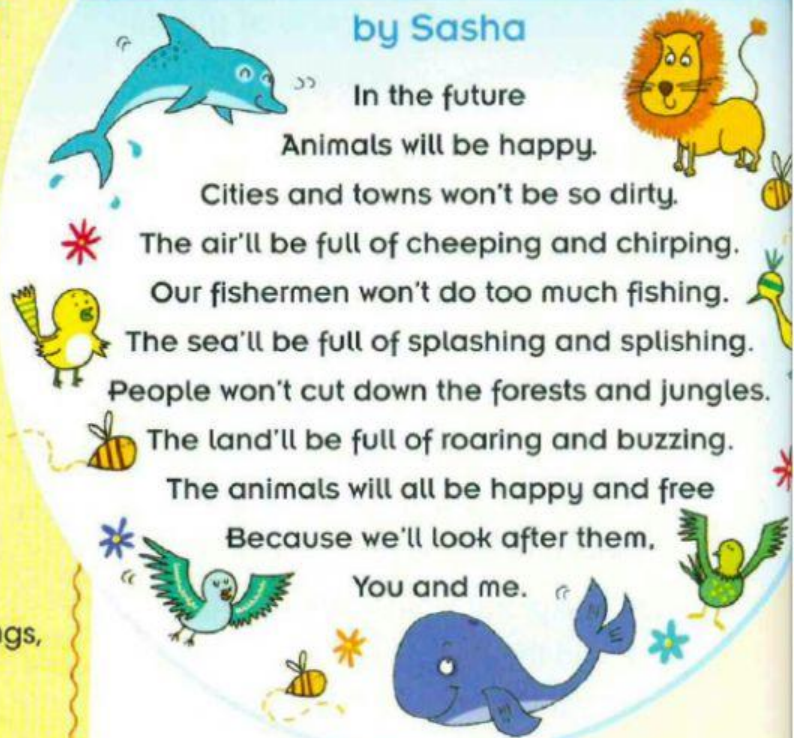
People won't cut down the forests and jungles.
