

# ADVENTURE WITH ADVERBS



An **adverb** is a word that modifies a verb, adjective, or another adverb.

## Types Of Adverbs:

**ADVERB OF MANNER** answers the question 'how' or 'in what manner' an action takes place. For example, We walked **slowly**. He speaks **politely**.

**ADVERB OF TIME** answers the question 'when' an action takes place. For example, I'd **sleep late**. Have you noticed him **today**?

**ADVERB OF PLACE** answers the question 'where' an action takes place. For example, He was sitting **nearby**. Go **there** and do your own work. Is that your mobile **there**?

**ADVERB OF DEGREE** tells us about the intensity or degree of an action ., For Example, It all happened **very** quickly. I am **extremely** happy for his achievement. He is **much** happy. She was **quite** surprised.

**ADVERB OF FREQUENCY** qualifies the meaning of a sentence by telling us how often or how frequently something happens. For example, I **usually** play in this ground.
