After Michael Chorost went deaf in 2001, he received a cochlear implant. A cochlear implant is a device which has one part inside the patient's head and the other part on the outside of the patient's ear. The device picks up sounds and sends electric signals to the brain. The brain then recognizes the signals and puts together patterns for the person to understand as language, music, or other sounds. The cochlear implant did not completely restore Michael's hearing, but his hearing did improve significantly. Regarding his hearing abilities with the implant, Chorost says, "I can hear you more than well enough to have a phone conversation, but I'm still very much a person with hearing loss." But according to

Chorost, having hearing loss isn't all that bad. "When I'm writing, I always take my processors [the outer part of the cochlear implant] off. I love to work deaf. Having normal ears would mean I couldn't shut off the world and concentrate." Chorost works as a biotechnical researcher. He looks for devices that partner with the natural, biological systems of the body to improve the way humans live. He has recently been developing a device that could help people communicate emotions through brain waves. The device would somehow pick up the emotions in one person's brain and send them to another person's brain. In a dangerous military situation, for example, this could help a soldier locate a fellow soldier in pain. Through this research as well as through his personal experience, Chorost believes that biotechnology can improve human life.


