Present Simple

Present: I wake up at 6 am every day.

Future (timetables/fixed events): The trains leaves at 7 pm.

I/You/We/They	He/She/It
+) I eat meat every day.	+) She eats meat every day.
-) I don't eat meat every day.	-) she doesn't eat meat every day.
?) Do I eat meat every day?	?) Does she eat meat every day?
Yes, I do. / No, I don't.	Yes, she does. / No, she doesn't.

Past simple

Completed activity in the past: I went to the park yesterday.

Chronological order: I woke up and took a shower.

I/You/We/They/He/She/It
+) I ate meat every day.
-) I didn't eat meat every day.
?) Did I eat meat every day?
Yes, I did. / No, I didn't.

Present Continuous

Progress in the present: I am watching Game Thrones. (progress)

Future: I am visiting my mother on Sunday. (arrangements/plans with other people)

I am /	He is /	She is /	It is	You are /	We are /	They are
+) I am eating a sandwich right now.						
-) I am not eating a sandwich right now.						
?) Am I eating a sandwich right now?						

Past continuous

Progress in the past: I was watching Game Thrones when you entered the room. (progress)

Set the atmosphere: It was late at night and the moon was shining and the wind blowing.

I was / He was / She was/It was / You were / We were / They were


- +) I was **eating** a sandwich.
-) I was not **eating** a sandwich.
- ?) **Was** I eating a sandwich.

What were you doing yesterday morning?

I was working.

Combine Past simple / Past continuous.

I was working when you called me.
You called me when I was working.



PRESENT PERFECT

Yo he / Tú has / Él ha / Nosotros hemos / Ellos han

I / You/We/They have He/She/It has

- +) I have eaten a lot of chocolate today.
(Yo he comido mucho chocolate el día de hoy)
-) I haven't eaten any chocolate today.
- ?) Have I eaten chocolate today?
Yes, I have/ No, I haven't.

PAST PERFECT

PRESENT PERFECT

Yo había / Tú habías / Él había / Nosotros habíamos / Ellos habían

I had worked in another company before working in CMA CGM

When I arrived in the office, my boss had already entered to a meeting.

I / You / We / They / He / She / It HAD

- +) I had eaten a lot of chocolate that day.
(Yo había comido mucho chocolate ese día)
-) I hadn't eaten any chocolate that day.
- ?) Had I eaten chocolate that day?
Yes, I had / No, I hadn't.

GOING TO

(predictions with evidence / plans and intentions)

- +) I am going to visit my mother next month.
-) I am not going to visit my mother next month.
- ?) Am I going to visit my mother next month?

WILL

(general facts / opinions / general predictions)

- +) I will see you tomorrow.
-) I will not (won't) see you tomorrow.
- ?) Will I see you tomorrow?
