




Reading plan 3: Molly goes to Rio de Janeiro (Week 16)

It is always accompanied by music, Michael. There is no capoeira without the music. Tell us about the instruments, Livia. What is that thing that looks like a fishing rod?


Fishing rod! Hah! That's a berimbau. It has a single string and you play it by hitting the string with a bow. Berimbau is also the title of an old, well-known song.
