Sharks are fish who live in the ocean. Sharks have lived on earth since before the dinosaurs!

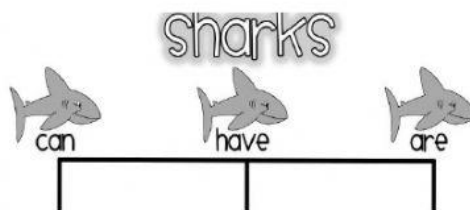


Most sharks are carnivores, or meat eaters. They eat fish, and sea mammals like seals, and dolphins.
