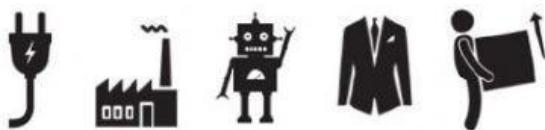

Robot suits

Can you lift 20 kilograms? How about 40 kilograms? Now imagine doing that non-stop, for hours and hours every day. This is the job of many workers around the world, and **it** isn't easy. What can we do to help these workers? One solution is a robot suit that you can wear.

Suits like these look like they're from movies or comic books, but **they** are real. In some countries, nurses, firefighters, and factory workers already use them. These strong metal suits use electricity to help people pick up and move heavy things. They make many difficult jobs easy.

But how much do suits like these help? Many people can lift about 30 to 40 kilograms. With robot suits, they can lift more than 100 kilograms. And that's not all. The suits do almost all the work for **them**. They help workers carry a lot more things for many more hours.

Suits like these are expensive, but there are some benefits for businesses. Over time, these robot suits save them money and they help keep their workers safe.
