Short adjectives ...	Spelling rules	Examples
Most of the adjectives	+ er	slow → slower fast → faster tall → taller
Ending in -e	+ r	large → larger nice → nicer
Some two-syllable adjectives, especially ending in -y	-y → -i + er	hungry → hungrier happy → happier funny → funnier
Ending in a vowel + a consonant	double the consonant + er	big → bigger fat → fatter fit → fitter
Irregular adjectives	don't follow rules	good → better bad → worse far → farther further
