THE ROMANS

This month, we're learning about ancient Rome.



On Monday, I watched a documentary with Megan about toys and pets in Rome. Small children had dolls and toys animals made of wood or clay. Bigger children had board games, balls and yoyos. Dogs were the most popular pets, but some families had monkeys and birds too.



On Wednesday, I went to the school library and read about Roman coins. They were made of gold, silver or bronze. In Rome, they made coins in a place next to the temple of Juno Moneta. The word "money" comes from "Moneta".

On Friday, I looked at some websites about Roman clothes. The Roman used brooches to tie their clothes. Important people wore togas. Togas were usually white, but the emperor wore a purple toga. Children wore tunics.
