All About Pigs

What do you think of when you think of a pig? Do you think of a cute little farm animal, or a muddy mess? Yes, it's true that pigs roll around in mud. They do it to cool off! Our bodies sweat to cool off, but pigs do not have sweat glands. So they must cool their bodies down another way. The cool, damp covering of mud on their bodies can keep the sun off their skin in the summer. Pretty smart!


In fact, pigs are one of the smartest animals in the world. Scientists think they are even smarter than dogs or human toddlers. Scientists think the grunts and squeals they make are their way of communicating to other pigs. A mother pig even makes sounds for its young that sound like singing.

When a pig is first born, it is called a piglet. It weighs only about 2.5 pounds (1.1 kg)! But it does not stay at that tiny size for long. In about a week, a piglet will double its weight. Some keep growing until they reach about 700 pounds (318 kg)!

What does an animal eat to get so big? Pigs that live in the wild eat a wide variety of foods. They eat leaves, fruits, and small animals. You may have noticed the big shouts that pigs have. They use these nostrils to sniff

out their meals. The skin on their noses is a sensitive, leathery material. It helps them search for and find their food. Pigs have an even better sense of taste than humans have. We have about 9,000 taste buds in our mouths. Pigs have 15,000 taste buds!
