The Paiwan are one of Taiwan's fourteen indigenous tribes that have lived on the island for thousands of years. Many of their old customs have been dying out as the country has modernized and members of the tribe have joined **mainstream** society. Recently, some of the tribe's elders have been trying to keep various traditions alive. Among these is the practice of witchcraft.

It isn't the type of witchcraft you see in *Harry Potter* movies, however. It consists of rituals and ceremonies considered important to tribal culture. Witches were traditionally relied on to treat diseases, bless people, and pray for the community to protect it from evil spirits. In the past, witches had a high status within the tribe. They played an important role, especially on major occasions such as before a hunt or when the year's crops were being planted, or at a funeral.

To keep the tradition going, the Paiwan have opened a class in Pingtung County,

where most of them live. The class has received financial support from the local government. It has more than ten students, and they are mainly housewives aged between 30 and 50. Among the lessons being taught are how to seek advice from the gods and communicate with dead ancestors.
