Grammar

Reported speech for questions

We use **reported speech** to say or repeat questions someone asked before the time of speaking.

To change the questions to reported speech, we

- use reporting verbs such as **ask**, **wonder**, etc.
- keep the question word (**who**, **what**, **where**, etc.) in a Wh- question.
Ben asked, "What do the H'Mông people do for a living?"
→ Ben **asked what** the H'Mông people did for a living.
- use **if/whether** when reporting Yes-No questions.
Ben asked, "Does your family celebrate the New Year?"
→ Ben **asked if/whether** my family celebrated the New Year.
