Mr Bean had a great week in Los Angeles. There were only one or two accidents!

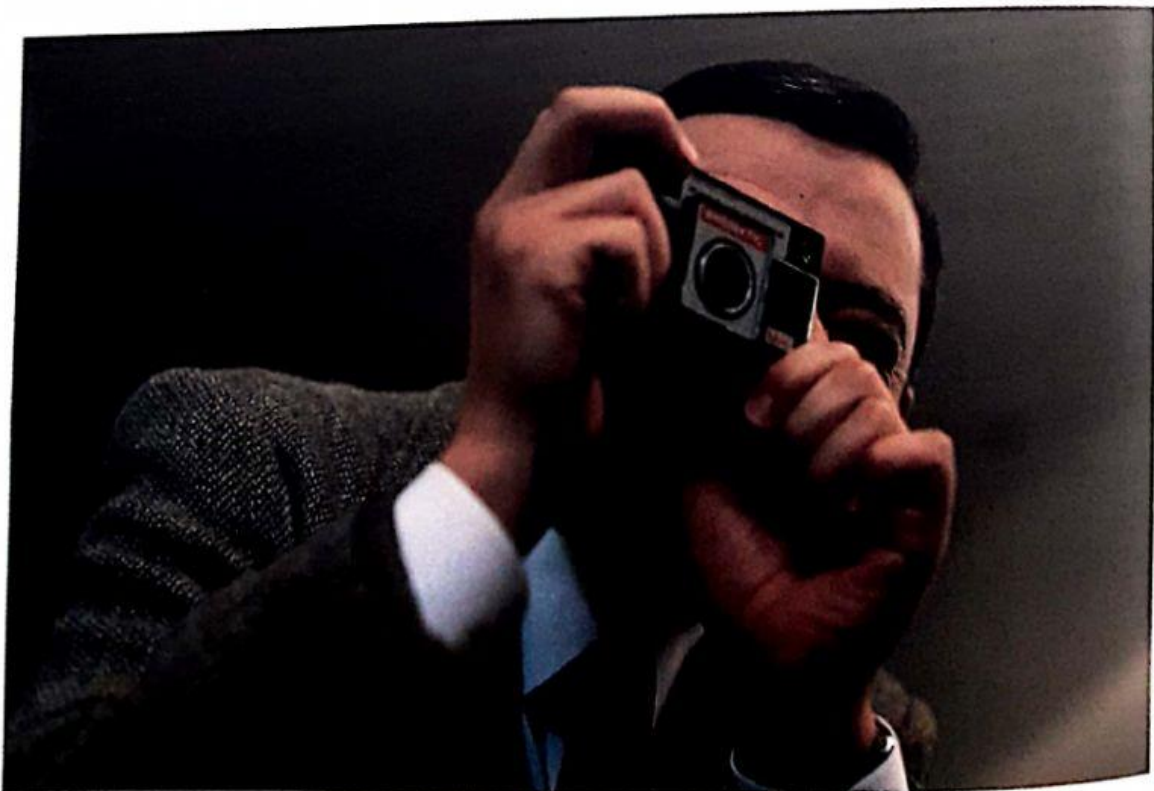

'It's a *poster*, David! A *poster*! So ... so ... where's the painting?'

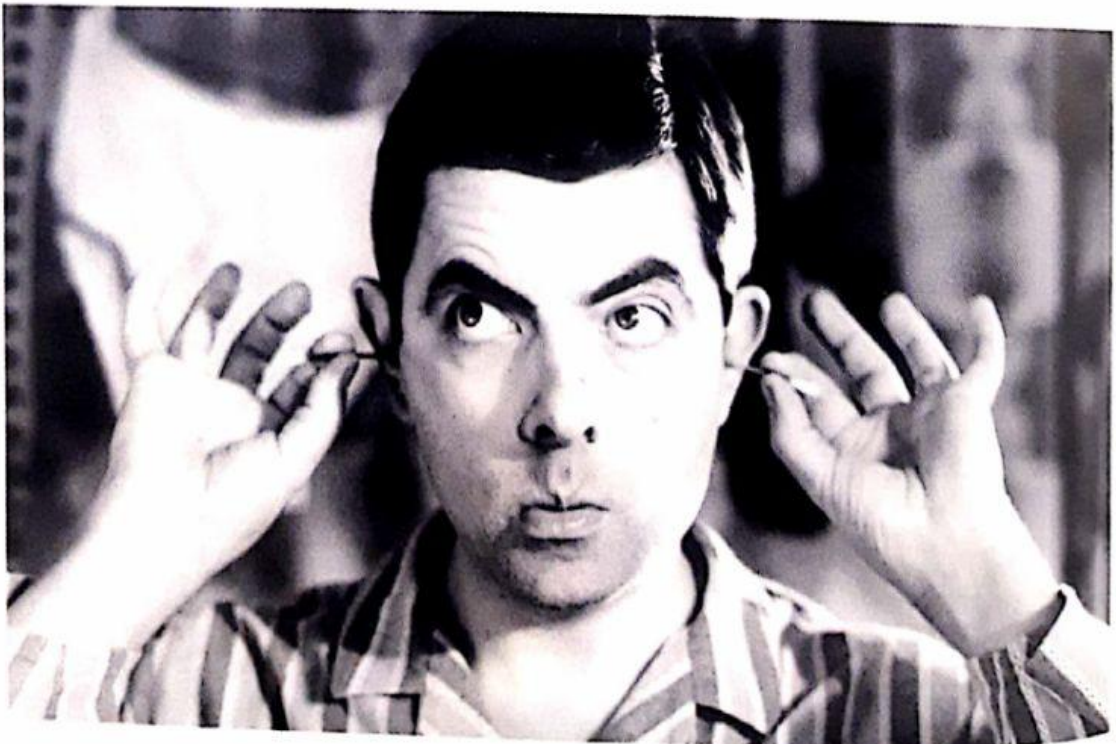


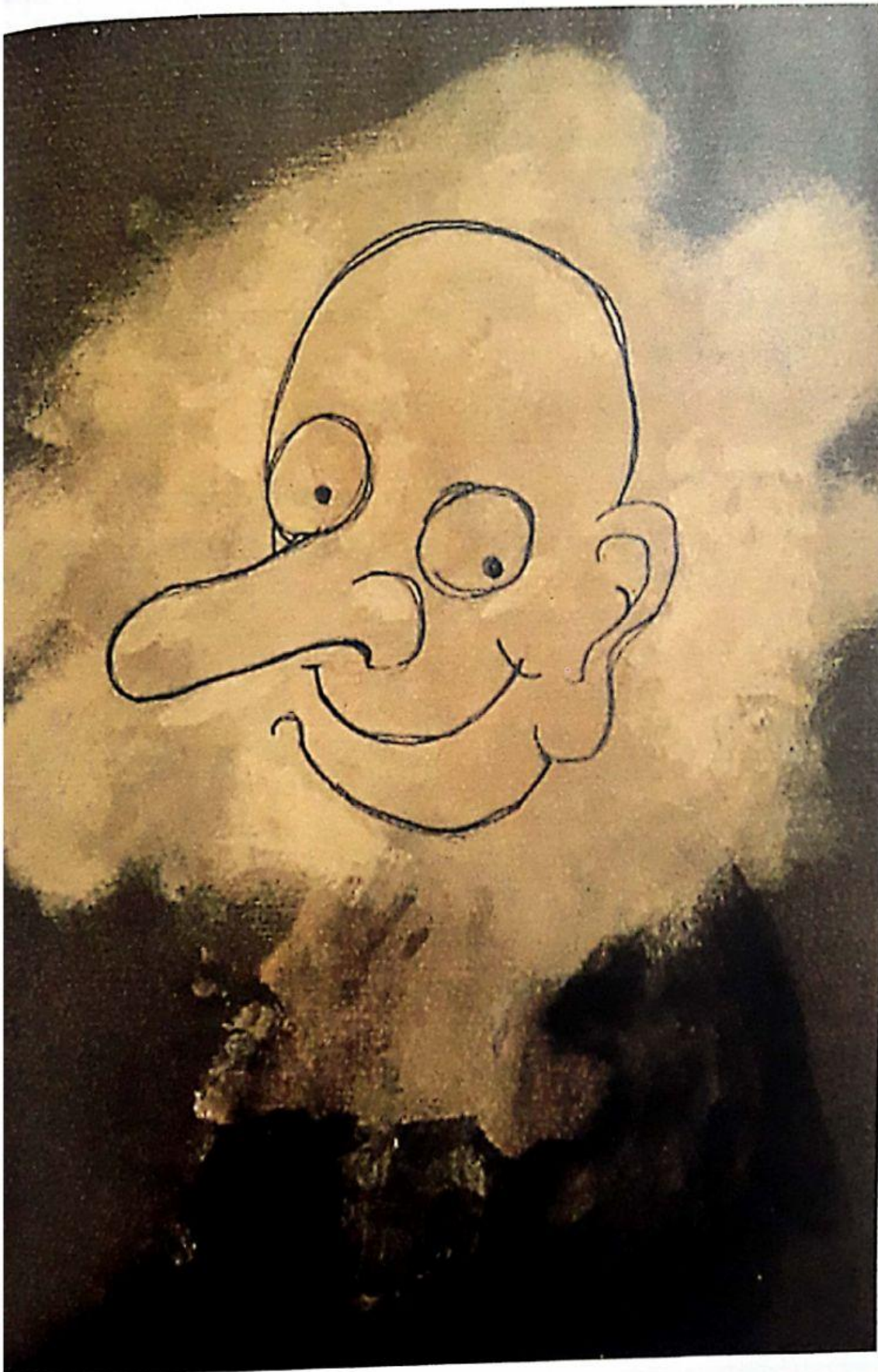
In England, Mr Bean got into bed. Before he went to sleep, he looked up at the wall opposite his bed and smiled.

- 2** Write about the book.

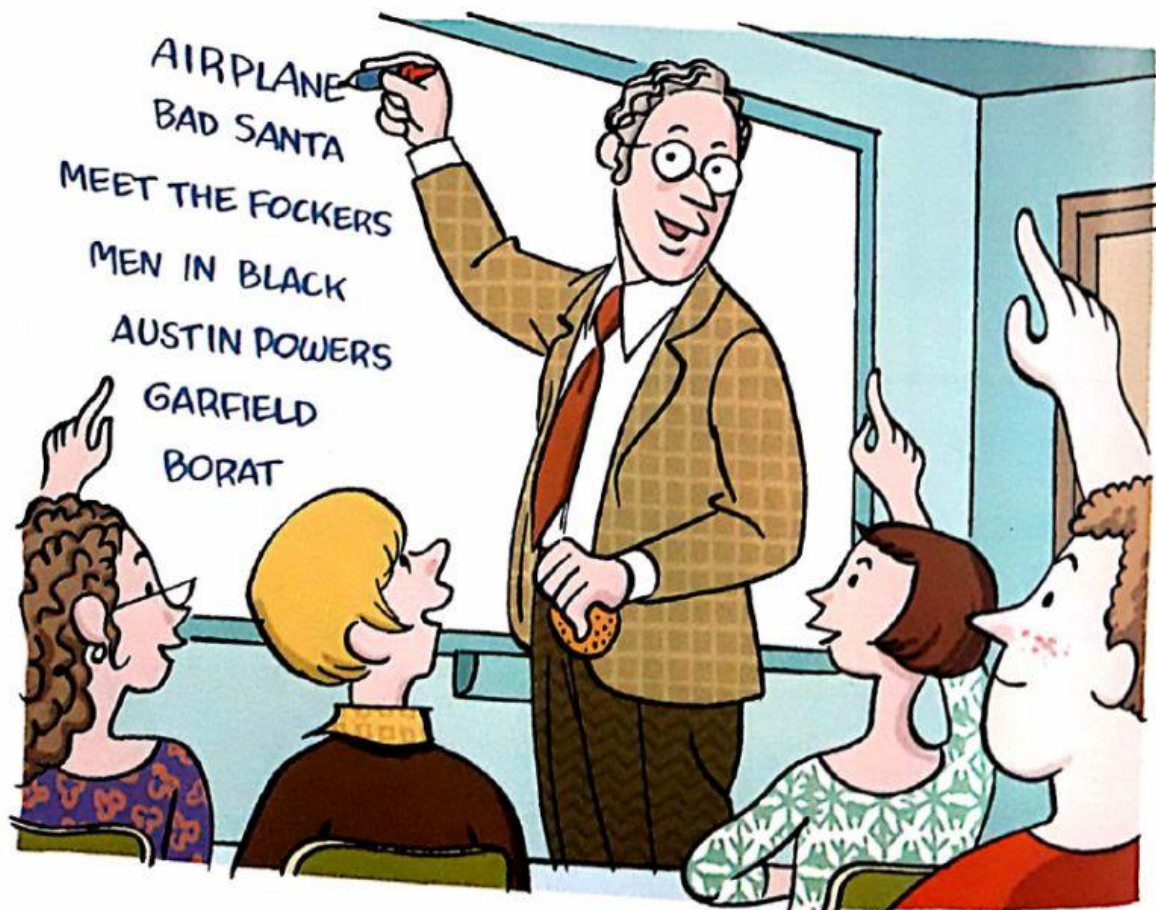
This is a very funny story about Mr Bean.

- d Which of the films do you know? Give each film a number from 1 (the best film) to the highest number (the worst film).
- e Ask other students about the films. Who gave the films the same numbers? Ask:
 - *What's your top film?*
 - *Which film did you put second (third, fourth ...)?*
 - *Which film did you put last?*

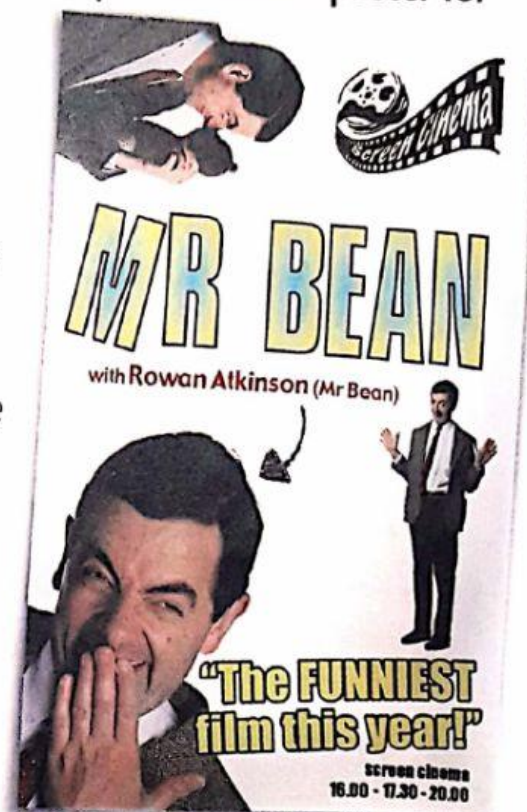


3 Work with another student with the same top film. Make a poster for your film.

The film is about a young man. He has a big problem: he can't find a girlfriend ...


- Who is in the film?
