

# Coordinating Conjunctions

**A coordinating conjunction is a conjunction that connects words, phrases, or clauses in a sentence.**

**The seven coordinating conjunctions are for, and, nor, but, or, yet, and so.**

**Example:** Felicity bought apples and oranges at the market.
