Jumber Lezhava, the world's cyclist

Jumber Lezhava is no ordinary cyclist. For almost ten years, he cycled around the world, alone, and visited almost every country on the planet.

Born in Georgia in 1939, Jumber became seriously ill in 1986. He nearly died, but luckily he went to hospital and an operation saved his life. As he rested after the operation, he made a life-changing decision: to travel around the world by bike.

When Jumber left home in 1993, he was already over 50 years old. However, over the next nine-and-a-half years he cycled more than 260,000 kilometres and visited more than 230 countries. He wanted to show people that it is important to be healthy. He also wanted to meet people from different countries and cultures.

The trip wasn't always easy. Animals chased him, people robbed him and even shot at him. Jumber can't speak English very well, so sometimes it was difficult to communicate.

And it wasn't always easy to find a place to stay: he didn't sleep in hotels every night!

During his trip he slept on beaches and even in hospitals.

There are seven countries that Jumber didn't visit: Libya, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Afghanistan, North Korea, Brunei and the Faroe Islands. He hopes he can visit these countries one day.

In May 2013, at the age of 74, Jumber began a new journey to 30 countries in Asia and Europe, covering 30,000 kilometres. Good luck, Jumber!
