Affirmative

I/You/We/They want to travel.

He/ She wants to travel.

Negative

I/You/We/They don't want to travel.

He/She doesn't want to travel.

Answer

I want to be a movie star.

He wants to go to the beach.

She wants to travel on Sunday.
