A Food Pantry

Every city or town has people in need. These people do not have much money. They may not have jobs. They may not have homes. They may not get enough to eat. They may need everyday things. They may need



soap or toothpaste. A community can help people in need. A food pantry is a great way to help someone.

The word *pantry* means a “small room used to store food.” Some homes have a pantry. It is a small room with shelves.

A food pantry has things people need. But it is not part of a person’s home. It may be a room in a building. It may be in a community center. Some are inside schools. Some are big and some are small.

Many people come to a food pantry. People who need help get food for free. They may get other things they need, too. The pantry opens on certain days.

People in the community help a food pantry. They volunteer. This means they work without pay. Some people work at the pantry. Others collect things to give to the pantry. Some put things away. People can also give money. The pantry uses it to buy what it needs.

Look at the list on this page. The list shows things a food pantry always needs. A food pantry will also ask for special things at times. It might gather things for school or for a holiday. Many give kids a chance to help. They set up special workdays. Kids come to be volunteers. Maybe you have one near you. Maybe you can help!
