He 6 \_\_\_\_\_ (describe / marry) an Italian woman called Mariantonietta Peru. She 7 \_\_\_\_\_ (plan / love) the idea of exploring too, and together, they 8 \_\_\_\_\_ (walk / plan) a journey across the Sahara Desert from west to east by camel and on foot. They 9 \_\_\_\_\_ (train / stop) for three months and then they 10 \_\_\_\_\_ (start / end) their journey. They 11 \_\_\_\_\_ (work / travel) about 7,250 kilometres and 12 \_\_\_\_\_ (arrive / live) at their destination 271 days later. Asher 13 \_\_\_\_\_ (decide / describe) the crossing in his book *Impossible Journey – Two Against the Sahara*.
