It's quite common for British teenagers to work part-time, usually at weekends but sometimes for one or two hours before or after school. One popular job for younger teens is a paper round. That means they deliver newspapers for their local newsagent. Most paper boys and girls have to get up very early. Other jobs include working in supermarkets, washing cars and working in a café or restaurant. There are strict laws about how many hours you can work; it depends on how old you are, but nobody is allowed to work more than two hours on a school day. If you're over 16, you should receive the minimum wage (or more!). That's about £3.72 an hour for 16 – and 17-year-olds.
