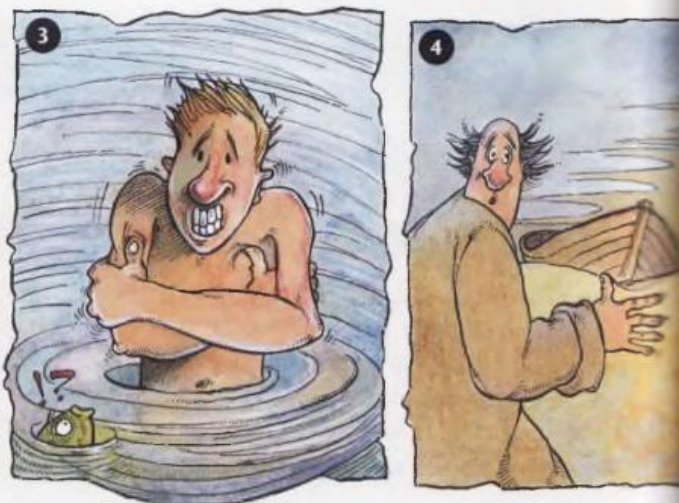
- 1 These pictures tell a story about the Loch Ness monster, but they are not in the correct order. What is happening in the pictures?

Today, the Loch Ness monster is famous round the world, but not many people realise that the stories about it started as long ago as AD 565. The first report described how St Columba, a monk, punished Scotland's most famous monster after it had attacked a man.

The story took place when Columba was living at Fort Augustus at the southern end of the loch. One day Columba asked one of his monks to swim across the loch and fetch a boat. The monk had heard people in the village talk about the monster but he wasn't frightened. It was a good day for a swim. Although it was very cold, the sun was shining and the water was calm. However, as he was crossing the loch he suddenly saw a strange creature. It was huge and had a long neck. He had not seen anything like it before. It was swimming not far away but didn't seem to notice the monk at first. A few minutes later, it suddenly stopped and looked at the swimmer. Then it rushed towards him and opened its frightful mouth in a roar. The man was terrified. Columba hurried down to the water's edge, got into a boat and rowed out into the lake. When he was near the monster, he cried out, 'Do not touch that man! Go!' and ordered the monster not to attack again. The monster looked at Columba for a moment, then turned and disappeared. The monster has not attacked anyone since. Indeed, for many years it was not seen in that part of the lake. Of course, nowadays no one knows if the story is true, but reported sightings of 'Nessie' continue to this day.
