


## Ways of Looking

(informal) look at something	see for the first time	look with the eyes wide open in surprise or shock. (old-fashioned)	look very carefully, as if not able to see well

look in a worried or angry way, moving down the eyebrows together	look quickly and secretly	look in an unpleasant way, suggesting ill will or lust	look at something for a long time with the eyes wide open

stare angrily or fiercely	look through the pages of a book or magazine; look at the goods in a shop without really wanting to buy anything	examine thoroughly and carefully	watch carefully

look at something, examine something	frown angrily	look with eyes half shut or turned sideways, or through a narrow opening	look directly or closely
